
## Core commitments

- Recognise the diversity of contributions to, and careers in, research in accordance with the needs and nature of the research
- Base research assessment primarily on qualitative evaluation for which peer review is central, supported by responsible use of quantitative indicators
- Abandon inappropriate uses in research assessment of journal- and publication-based metrics, in particular inappropriate uses of Journal Impact Factor (JIF) and b-index

 Avoid the use of rankings of research organisations in research assessment

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



# Location of journals used in THE & QS Rankings









# What can institutions do?


- Accepting the rankings is an unacceptable position for any intellectually credible institution that claims to care about knowledge equity.
- Rejecting the rankings can amount to financial and reputational suicide

# What **can't** institutions do?

## Nothing

- If you're not part of the solution, you're part of the problem.
- A time is coming when university reputation will be assessed not only by how it's judged by the rankings, but by how it engages with the rankings

# Use of the rankings

## Institutional decisions should not be driven by rankings

Universities should follow holistic institutional strategies, instead of investing considerable time and energy in improving rankings results.

Do not use rankings in evaluations, for budget allocation purposes and in other policy contexts.

# Communication about the rankings

## Universities have a duty to educate:

- Educate external stakeholders in the uses and misuses of rankings
- Encourage students to conduct their own research rather than just using rankings.
- An institution's decision for or against participating in a ranking exercise should be clearly explained and communicated, as should the meaning of any given outcome or score.

# Collaboration with the rankings

Universities should consider the nature of their collaborations with the rankings:

- Not submitting data and information for commercial ranking purposes or
- ...making the submitted data also publicly available on their websites.
- ▶ Not participating in reputation surveys distributed by rankers.
- Not purchasing products and services from the commercial rankers.
- Not hosting or participating in events organised by the commercial rankers.

# Alternatives to the rankings

## Universities should support better ways of assessing university performance.

- U-Multirank (quantitative)
- More Than Our Rank (qualitative)

#### More Than Our Rank

The More Than Our Rank initiative has been developed in response to some of the problematic features and effects of the global university rankings. It provides an opportunity for academic institutions to highlight the many and various ways they serve the world that are not reflected in their ranking position. This initiative is meant for every academic institution, whether ranked or unranked, top 10 or yet to place. It is an initiative for institutions who are proud of their ranking position but also recognize the limitations of the indicators used, and for those who feel that the rankings do not reflect their strengths or institutional mission. Every institution in the world is much more than their rank. This initiative is simply an opportunity to publicly say so and explain why.


#### Why participate?
